

#### A LETTER FROM POLAND...

TOMASZ MASUR of the Random Division of the Polish Tatra Society has kindly sent some information on the TATRAS, which are the highest section of the CARPATHIAN chain of mountains in Poland, to Sean Dunne, and is available on request. The following is an extract from the letter Tomasz sent to the An Oige Hillwalkers Club.

Information from the Radom Division of The Polish Tatra Society dedicated to HILLWALKERS CLUB from Dublin, Ireland.

(There is polish translation on p. 5-8)

I visited Ireland in August 1993 and although my stay had a strictly professional character I found plenty of time for sightseeing and mountaineering, my favourite activity. Ireland is a really green island inhabited by really smiling people. Lying near the empire of Great Britain it has history very similar to that of Poland. Now, Ireland is a modern European country, where tourists are welcome. The best developed tourist centre is Co.Galway on the west. Connemara is the name given to the portion of this region between Lough Corrib and the Atlantic with superb scenic rocky mountains known as the Twelve Bens (700 m). With an enormous number of picturesque lakes, swift-flowing

streams and stretches of moorland it remains a remote and unspoilt district of natural beauty. The majestic cliffs of Moher, which arise from the ocean to a height of 200 m and extend for 8 km, cut off the Burren Mountain - rocky domed hills with visible signs of erosion, in Co.Clare on the south side of Galway Bay. The real tourist should also explore the Aran Islands formed by limestone reefs at the gateway to this bay and see the old Gaelic forts. After 2-weeks in Galway I moved to Dublin. The capital of Ireland has as a neighbour mountainous district of Co.Wicklow (925 m Lugmeguilla Mountain). The most famous tourist route is the Wicklow Way, a long distance (129 km) walking path from Dublin to Clonegal Co. Clare. Together with the members of the Hillwal-kers Club from Dublin guided by Seán Dunne, crossing a huge peatbog and climbing a few hills we ended up at Djouce Mountain (725 m). Although my shoes and socks were completely wet, I enjoyed very much the view of the sea and the fascinating mountains at the same time. Visiting Ireland you should not forget to enter a pub, and drink a pint of Guinness, of course.

Radom Division of Polish Tatra Society. Radom lies about 600 km from the Tatras (6-7 hours by car). In spite of this rather long distance the Division of the Society was founded as early as 1928, and its members were enthusiastic hikers in the Tatras and the Black Mountains in the eastern Carpathians which today belong to the Ukraina. The new Division in Radom started its activities in 1990 and soon numbered 200 members from three nearby towns: Radom, Deblin and Białobrzegi. The Club meetings, where video-films, slides and photos from former trips are presented, take place once a month. The excursions for the next weeks are also scheduled. There are walks in the nearby Kozienice Forest and Holy Cross Mountains in spring and autumn and camping trips of several days' duration in higher mountains as well as training centres for rock climbing in summer. In winter, ski schools for beginners are organized. The main purpose of this activity is to train self-reliant mountain tourists who are able to plan an expedition, organize the group and ensure it safely when in the mountains. The Academic Club related to the Technical University of Radom is the most active tourist group.
