

CLUB TRAVEL

Tatra Mountains - Slovakia

A sixteen day trip to the Czech Republic and Slovakia last June was an amazing and worthwhile experience.

Having spent four days sightseeing in Prague, we travelled to The Small Tatra Mountains for

two days walking. Chopok - 2,024 metres is a lovely walk and is the second highest mountain in the area. I can recommend the hut on its summit for a lovely warming bowl of soup.

We then travelled to Poprad - quite a large town and from there to Tatranska Lomnica which is a beautiful quiet town. It is also a ski resort in the winter. The town of Stary Smokovec is a local train journey and well worth a visit.

One of the most spectacular walks we had on this trip was to Teryho Chata at 2,015

metres.. All of the tracks in this area are colour coded, but navigate carefully if there is snow lying on the route. Usually the colours indicating the way are marked high on rocks along the route. This walk started in Stary Smokovec - cable car/green track to Hrebinenok, red track to Zamkovskeho and then green track to Teryho Chata. Try the cabbage borsch soup.

There are very strict rules about the time of year and the areas where hiking is allowed. The maps indicate the prohibited areas between 1 November and 30 June. If walking at other times, it is advisable to enquire about the condition of the trails at the huts. The paths marked on the maps

are all colour coded. It is possible to stay in Teryho and cross into Poland (passport necessary) once the paths are open.

Many high paths were closed for us at the beginning of June, but endless options exist up to 2,000 metres.
