

Club Travel

THE SNOWS OF KILIMANJARO

At the end of July this year a group of eleven of us from the Hillwalker's Club joined an Explore Trip to Kilimanjaro. We spent our first two nights in Tanzania at the Mountain Inn, a modest hotel near the town of Moshi, before beginning our big adventure. Our accommodation for the next six days would be in mountain huts accompanied by our team of porters, cooks, local guides as well as Chris the Explore guide. In addition to this we had been joined by five other people.

The first day took us through luscious rainforest on muddy tracks to the Mandara Hut (2745m). The second day we reached Horombo Hut (3750m). We were now above the clouds and the air was noticeably thinner. A few people were already showing signs of altitude sickness. We spent two nights here, allowing a day for acclimatization. That day we trekked to the saddle of Mawenzi Peak (4375m). The following morning was a big day for us. We set out for Kibo Hut (4725m) where we would sleep for about four hours before starting our summit attempt.

The track climbed up from Horombo, then leveled out into an open semi-desert area; here we had rain and then hail which thankfully didn't last too long. We started to climb again and finally Kibo came into view, a white roof against a backdrop of gray rock and scree. It didn't look like a very inviting place.

The altitude had really started to kick in and a lot of people were sick, including Tom, my partner, who just lay on his bunk unable to even take off his boots. For Martin, who had organized the trip for us, the sickness turned out to be a bit more serious; his ulcer had chosen this or all times to act up. Chris decided that he and Martin should descend right away and Tom opted to go with them as he was sure he could go no higher.

After a broken sleep, followed by tea and biscuits, the rest of us set out at midnight for the summit attempt. The head guide set the pace, which was slow but still to fast for me. After about an hour both Frankie and I began to fall behind the group. He seemed to be in a similar condition to myself, which was not very good!

Finally we reached Hans Meyer Cave (5150m) half way to Gilmans Point. Frankie and I could go not further, and after a short rest started to descend along with our guide James. At the time it seemed like sickness had dominated the night, but now there are other things I remember more. The trails of light, as climbers sneaked their way up the mountain, the voices of the guides calling to each other, the lights of a town in Kenya which looked so close. Even though I didn't make it to the top I feel very privileged to have had the opportunity to try.

Late that morning the rest of the group began their return. Out of sixteen of us, twelve had made it to the top. Four to Gilmans Point (5680m) and eight all the way to Uhuru (5895m). Later that day we returned to Horombo where Tom was waiting for us. The next morning we set off down the mountain, stopping at Mandara for a cooked lunch. This went down a treat as appetites had returned. Then back down through the forest to the park entrance.

Before we knew it we were on our way back to the hotel, dreaming of hot showers and the sunny beaches of Zanzibar. It was the end of an adventure which I for one will never forget.
