
Club Travel – Backpacking in the Sierra Nevada

Last September Tom and I spent our holidays in the Sierra Nevada and the Alpujarras Mountains in the South of Spain. We flew to Malaga and from there took a bus to Granada. From here we traveled on to Alpufarras and Berchules.

Here we were a little worried to find what seemed like the only pension in the village closed. But as it turned out, the room we found was the best we had on this trip and cost 4,000 pstas. £20 including breakfast. The following morning we set out on our first day's walking. From the highest part of the village we followed a trail heading west. All went well for an hour or so until our track met a forestry road. We were unable to find our route on the other side of the road. We headed up a fire break break which seemed to be roughly where our track should have been. By now the day was hot and trudging up a steep fire break with full packs was a real killer. We passed a gate with a track on the other side. Could this be the track we were looking for? The sign on the gate read PRIVATE and something about dogs. We decided not to risk it. Fotunately a forestry worker showed us the track

Back in Granada we decided to climb Veleta (3.396m) as a day hike. This was easily done by taking a 9.00am bus for the Sierra Nevada (this bus returns by 5.00pm.). The road goes practically all the way to the top. It was a sunny morning when we set out. However, by the time we reached the summit cold wet cloud had obliterated all the views. After our failed attempts of the past few days we were glad to be on the summit. Overall the trip was good with no shortage of excitmeent. We would both like to return to this are some time. Let's hope the weather and the mountains will look more kindly on us the next time.
