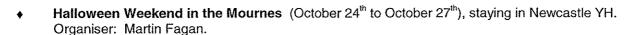
### **MOUNTAIN SAFETY NOTE**

Opening checkpoint: The walk starts at Killanure (Grid Ref.: S 890 537) and finishes at Byrnes

Pub, Glin (Grid Ref.: S 745 395).

Checkpoint opening time: 7.30a.m. Latest start time: 8.30a.m..

Checkpoint list: Killanure - Top of Track - (Blackrock Mtn. 1,973ft) - Mt. Leinster 2,610ft. -

(Knockroe 1,777 ft.) - Scullogue Gap - Blackstairs Mtn. 2,409ft. - (Cahir Roe's Den) - (1,813ft.) - Carrigalakhan Gap - (1,679ft.) - Ballycrinnigan

#### Note from the organisers:

Participants must be over 17 years of age. The latest time to reach the checkpoint at Scullogue Gap is 1.00p.m. and the walk must be finished by 6.30p.m. A campsite is available at St. Mullins. Two busses will leave at 6.45a.m. for the start of the walk. One will leave from St. Mullins (the campsite, the other from Glynn. The bus trip will cost £2.00, payable on the bus. Participants are advised not to drive to the start of the walk as there is no official transport from the finish back to the start. The bus should be used to the start.

PLEASE NOTE These walks are NOT led hikes. Participants need to know how to navigate and have a high level of fitness. You are responsible for yourself during these walks. A necessary amount of training should be undertaken before participating.

## WOMEN ON TOP!!



What kind of woman leaves loved ones, luxuries and loos behind and heads for the North Pole?

Recently skincare company Neutrogena - whose Norwegian Formula Hand Cream was developed to protect the skin of Arctic fishermen - issued a challenge to find Britain's 20 toughest women to take part in the first all female expedition to the North Pole which includes walking 420 nautical miles to get there.

Of all the applicants fifty were chosen to attend a four day Polar Selection Course last September. At the end of the course this number was whittled down to two teams of eight with four others held in reserve. The contenders - of all ages and backgrounds - earned their places on the expedition purely on merit. although as part of the challenge they had to raise  $\mathfrak{L}5,000$  sponsorship.

Caroline Hamilton (33) was chosen to head the group which is called the Polar Relay Team. She was chosen because of her backpacking experience in Asia. East Africa, South America, Russia and Europe. The part of the trip she is most looking forward to is while at the North Pole she is going to walk in a small circle three times through every time zone in the world!

The women have been training in various locations around Britain. Part of their training also included learning how to cross-country ski at Resolute Bay.

The expedition headed out in early March and they are expected back at the end of May.

## **IRELAND'S BEST KEPT SECRET**

Five Hillwalkers set off to take part in the Easter Walking Festival at Manorhamilton.

On Saturday we paid our entrance fee of £10 which allowed us to take part in 3 days hiking with local guides. The walks were graded easy, moderate and not too difficult. Our first hike "The Swiss Valley Trail" brought us up King's Gully and on to Benbulbin summit where excellent views of the surrounding Sligo landscape, north Leitrim mountains and further afield to Slieve League in Co. Donegal were enjoyed by all. Later we visited the disused Barytes mines at Carbery before descending towards Glencar through the hidden and beautifully named Swiss Valley.

Day two we led on a hike with the intriguing title of "Gibbons Mill Wheel Hike". We went from the small hamlet of Mullies up to the Dartry Range which has many hidden treasures. The hills here have many interesting features which include many small attractive lakes, a majestic standing stone and a number of very well constructed and maintained cairns. And of course the mill wheels. It seems that in the last century one Mr. Gibbons set about fashioning 4 massive stone mill wheels, two of which were soon carted off and put into use in local mills. The second pair for some unknown reason were left behind. They now lie forgotten in the heather desert of Mill Wheel Hill, a testimony to a past age and they somehow remind one of the two "vast and trunkless legs of stone" of Ozymandias which also lie forgotten in the sand of a far off desert. The hike finished in spectacular fashion descending from the height of Arroo Mtn. down the cliff on a narrow sheep path. Under the cliffs we were fortunate enough to spot a Peregrine Falcon flying high up beside the sheer rock-wall of the escarpment. A road walk brought us to the village of Kinlough where refreshments were had with great gusto in the "Tickled Trout"

On our third day a 3 hour combined hike for all walkers was arranaged to the "deserted village of Crumpaun". The route was from Cloontyprughlish (I kid you not) up to the spectacular Eagles Rock and down through the deserted village of Crumpaun.

I feel I speak for all our group when I say Deirdre, Fiona, Joan Ray and I left with an overall feeling of having taken part in something special. It was a lovely friendly event and a credit to the organisers.

### **BOOK REVIEW**

"A Hard Day's Summer" by Alison Hargreaves, Price £6.99 (Coronet Books) ISBN 0340647027

In her lifetime Alison Hargreaves achieved more than many modern mountaineers could have ever dreamed of accomplishing, sadly she died recently on K2. The book "A Day's Summer" describes her attempt to climb the six major Alpine north faces solo in one season.

The book catalogues her attempts on the famous (and infamous) mountains of the Grandes Jorasses, the Matterhorn, the Eiger, the Badile, the Dru and the Cima Grande. In addition to the compelling descriptions of the various north face routes the book also describes how she balanced the climbing and her family life together with her two young children and husband who accompanied her on her Journey through France, Switzerland and Italy.

Unfortunately the author reveals little of herself in the book and resultantly it lacks some of the passion which generally accompanies mountaineering literature. Another disappointing feature of the book is the frequency with which she mentions her sponsor's products. This may be attributed though to the very real requirement of funding her subsequent expeditions.

This book, being her only work, will stand testament to her ambition and ability as a mountaineer.

#### "The Big Brainwave Walkabout"

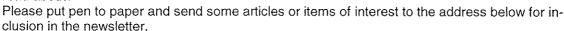
