The Committee requests that anyone who is on medication or with a medical condition inform the leader before the hike.



1998 IRISH EXPEDITION NEWS



Irish K2 Expedition 1998 (June-August)

A strong team comprising Eddie Cooper, Martin Daly, Paul Dunlop, Donie O'Sullivan, Ian Rea, Calvin Torrans and two Scottish climbers will attempt the Abruzzi Ridge of K2 in Alpine style without oxygen. At 8,611m K2, the second highest mountain in the world, is difficult by any route. This ridge was first attempted by the Duke of Abruzzi's party in 1909. It was first climbed by an Italian Expedition in 1954 having previously repelled three serious attempts by American parties in 1938, 1939 and 1953. Broad Peak, 8,047m is the secondary objective of the team.

Irish Nepalese Himalayan Expedition 1998

Garth Henry, Malcolm McNaught, Ciaran O'Hara and Kevin Quinn will attempt Jongsong Peak (7,483m) by the unclimbed South Face and Kirat Chuli (7,365m) by the unclimbed North Ridge. This will be a joint expedition with four Nepali climbers. Jongsong Peak, on the Sikkim/Nepal border was first climbed in 1930 by an international expedition which included Frank Smythe. It has hardly been visited since then - probably because of political access problems. It involves a long glacier approach. Kirat Chuli was first climbed by a German team in 1939. They are both very worth-while objectives.

SPECIAL INTEREST HIKE

This special hike, the details of which are on page one in the Sunday Hikes' section, will finish early at Knockree Youth Hostel.

A commemoration which includes the unveiling of a seat dedicated to the memory of the late Charlie O'Byrne (an An Óige Council member) who gave many years of voluntary service to the Association and had close ties with Knockree Youth Hostel.

The ceremony will be presided over by our good friend Eddie McGrane.
