MAAM TURKS WALK DETAILS

3rd May 1997. Date:

Organising Club: UCG Mountaineering Club, Galway, Map No: Discovery Sheet No. 45 and 37 Fee: £5.00 (payable on the day)

Opening checkpoint: The walk starts at the base of Corcóg Mtn. and finishes at Leenaun

Checkpoint opening time: 7.00AM. and closes at 8.00AM. sharp.

Checkpoint list: Start - Corcóg - Patrick's Well - Binn idir an Dá Log - Lough Mhám

Ochóige (first finish) - Letterbrackaun - Maumturkmore - 562m (spot

height before Leenaun Hill) - finish at car park at old hotel in Leenaun

Distance: 15 miles/24km. Height gain: 8,000ft./2430m.

Average time: 10 hours in good weather and without breaks. From the beginning of the walk to Patrick's Well should take 3 hrs. From Patrick's Well to Lough Mhám Ochóige should take 3.5 hrs. This is the first finish of the walk. There is a walk-out route here back to the start of the walk. There is a cut off time at Maumturkmore at 3.30PM. From Lough Mhám Ochóige to the finish in Leenaun should take 4.5 hrs.

There will be a shuttle bus from Leenaun back to the beginning of the walk which will leave every hour (or when the bus is full). There will be some light refreshments at the closing checkpoint. The organising club will not be providing water along the route and since there is very little water along the way, participants are advised to carry enough water and food for the the entire walk.

PLEASE NOTE These walks are NOT led hikes. Participants need to know how to navigate and have a high level of fitness. You are responsible for yourself during these walks. A necessary amount of training should be undertaken before participating.

AND ANOTHER THING...

HOW SAFE IS YOUR TENT?

Fires in backpacking are fairly rare but the potential exists, given the flammable nature of many camping materials. Standard advice is not to cook in the tent, but in bad weather most people end up cooking in the porch. In the British Isles there is no legislation on the flame retardant properties of tent fabrics.

The following are examples of some commonly used fabrics:

Canvas. Pros: is robust and has a reduced tendency for condensation. Cons: it can burn, is heavy and is prone to mildew if stored damp.

Nylon. Pros: is lightweight, has a small pack size and the seams can be taped. Cons: is prone to condensation and the fabric which is coated only on one side sags when wet.

Silicone elastomer coated nylon. Pros: is the strongest waterproof flysheet fabric available. Cons: highly flammable and can't be taped.

Polyester. Pros: less saggy. Cons: condensation, strength for weight is not as good as nylon.

Conclusion: The problem with adding flame retardancy to a synthetic tent fabric is that the finished product is significantly weaker. The flame retardant additive will reduce its tear strength and resistance to UV. The general view among manufacturers is given the low incidence of tent fires, the consumer would rather have top performance than sacrifice it in favour of molly-coddling. Flame retardant fabrics still burn, they just burn less quickly or extinguish themselves once the source of ignition is removed.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

From the Dublin/Wicklow Mountain Rescue

The Dublin/Wicklow Mountain Rescue Team wrote to thank the Club for their donation of £200, and to let us know how they are progressing. In 1995 they acquired a second vehicle - a Land Rover. They were able to do this with the assistance of the National Lottery and Rover Ireland.

The Mountain Rescue are the only emergency service, whose members are all volunteers and for which there is not monetary gain made by anyone. In 1996 they set themselves the task of providing each member with a suitable set of rain gear. A mountain rescue member could have up to £1,500 worth of personal gear with them while on call out. To assist the members, and as a way of acknowledging their efforts, last September the Mountain Rescue were in a position to provide the team with "RAB Pertex Jackets and Salopettes".

Their next project is to up-grade their Communications Systems and then replace their team van.

Last year the Dublin/Wicklow Team operated on a budget of almost £24,000. Items such as training, insurance, equipment, communications, transport and of course the RAB gear accounted for their major expenditure. Their income came from a £6,700 government grant, a golf day and and two street collections - one in Dublin and one in Wicklow. Donations, particularly from walking clubs also help to keep the kitty topped up.

In 1996 the Team received 21 calls. This number was slightly down on the 1995 total of 25. Of the 21 calls attended to, they dealt with 9 casualties and were involved in 12 searches for 36 people missing or overdue in the hills. Two of the call-outs, sadly involved fatalities Already, this year they have responded to three calls, all in the Glendalough area.

BOOK REVIEW

"Storms of Silence" by Joe Simpson, Price £7.99 (Jonathan Cape UK) ISBN 0224042165

Joe Simpson in the few short years since publishing "Touching the Void" has gained a considerable presence in the world of mountaineering literature. This book is his fourth published book and deals geographically with trekking and climbing in both Nepal and Peru but stripping away the mountaineering content reveals a book devoted to considerations of life, death, fear and survival.

Despite the weight of the topics which are dealt with in the book, Joe Simpson manages to maintain a light momentum throughout leaping from the spectre of death to 'pints' in the local before the reader plummets into the depths of depression.

As a travelogue the book provides very attractive accounts of trekking and climbing in both Nepal and Peru with enough bait to lure the most committed Armchair Mountaineers from the safety of their sitting rooms.

In summary I would recommend the book to anyone who enjoys mixing an adventurous read with a brief dissertation on the timeless struggle of humanity!!
